DALLAS ARBORETUM & BOTANICAL GARDEN

THE SIXTH FLOOR MUSEUM

The Sixth Floor Museum at Dealey Plaza chronicles the life, assassination and legacy of President John F. Kennedy with documentary films, photographs and artifacts. Walk through a timeline of Kennedy's life and presidency and the moments of November 22, 1963 as the entire nation stood still. A live feed from the museum webcam features a real-time view from the sniper spot, and two areas in the museum were recreated to appear as they did in 1963.

DALLAS ARTS DISTRICT

It is home to some of Dallas' most significant cultural landmarks, museums and performing arts venues, including the multi-venue AT&T Performing Arts Center, Dallas Museum of Art, Nasher Sculpture Center, Crow Collection of Asian Art, Meyerson Symphony Center and Moody Performance Hall. DALLAS MUSEUM OF ART (DMA)

ENTERTAINMENT DISTRICTS

TRINITY GROVES

The 15-acre restaurant, retail, artist and entertainment destination sits at the base of the Margaret Hunt Hill Bridge in West Dallas.
